Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope this letter finds you well.

Daubeney continues to remain open for pupils in Nursery, Reception, year 1, year 6 and children of key workers and for vulnerable pupils. These provisions operate in pods of pupils and staff to try and minimise the risk of infection. Our teachers and support staff are working across the pods for these year groups and childcare provision. At this time we will not be opening for further year groups until September. I understand this will be disappointing for parents in those year groups but we appreciate your patience and understanding at this time as we bring this academic year to a close and prepare ourselves for what we anticipate will be a challenging year ahead.

To support your child(ren)'s home learning , weekly home learning plans will continue for the relevant year groups for the remainder of the year and Google Classroom activities will also continue for Y2 & our KS2 year groups. Teachers will continue to conduct welfare phone calls to the families of pupils that have not returned to school.


