Mr Logan, Head of School, had this to say, "It was a great opportunity to visit the BBC in Manchester and speak about issues that affect our children and our school. I hope in some small way it contributed to the result of the election and will encourage those in government to review the funding formula for schools and their intention to remove universal free school meals for KS1 children and replace this with universal free breakfasts."

1A have been having fun learning about fractions. They learnt about halves and quarters of shapes. They drew pizzas and split them into equal pieces.



